We have been working with Roy Lara on reforestation projects in small communities around Trinidad, Honduras since 2006. This work came to be known as the Trinidad Conservation Project. In 2008, Sustainable Harvest International hired Roy and incorporated this project into its program. The Trinidad Conservation Project has now been expanded to include sustainable agriculture as well reforestation, intensive training in five villages instead of two, and a commitment to work with farming families in these communities for at least five years.

Roy approaches his work with passion and always with a big heart. As a field trainer for SHI-Honduras, he truly makes a difference in the lives of over 70 farming families in five poor mountain villages and, through schools and community groups, to many more nearby communities.

Please join us and be inspired by what Roy, Sustainable Harvest-Honduras, and Sustainable Harvest International have been able to accomplish. Also hear from some of the women from the Washington DC area about their experience of visiting these five villages and to see and take part in the work of the Trinidad Conservation Project earlier this year.
