Wednesday Night Supper Forum: From Repentance to Repair Wednesday, February 28th at 7pm

The Anti-Racism Task Force invites you to a conversation with Rev. Greg Maggiano, Rector of Memorial Episcopal (Baltimore) and Susan Schulken, member of the Committee on Diocesan Reparations and of Grace Episcopal (Silver Spring), who will talk about (i) their parish histories of racial injustice and why they came to a Christian conviction to take action, (ii) what their churches have done, or are planning to do, to repair that injustice, and (iii) what lessons they have learned. Last year at this time, Duke Kwon spoke to the parish about his book Reparations: A Christian Call For Repentance and Repair and how the call to make reparations grows out of our fundamental Christian beliefs. The conversation on February 28 will inform us what fellow congregations are doing in answer to that call.



For the first 300 years of Christianity there was no single text or scroll or book that contained the entire New Testament available to the churches that met in the name of Jesus. It was passed on orally. "Gospellers" (many not literate themselves) would memorize what they could and travel to small house churches in their region. Thus the Gospel would be proclaimed most often without a text, in something that resembled a public speech or simple performance.

Before Easter intends to recreate some of that early church feel. It offers the Gospel of Mark from a single narrator from memory. The entire Gospel before Jesus descends the Mount of Olives to Jerusalem, Mark chapters 1-10; everything before the events we remember as "Holy Week."

The play is fully immersive; the main locations and participants of the Gospel will "inhabit" different sections of the church and willing audience members will be called into telling and recreating the story itself. The play will hopefully be very compelling for children of all ages 4 and up.

Christian churches often do a great job retelling (in dramatic form) the last pieces of the story of Jesus: betrayal in the garden of Gethsemane, the trial before Pilate, the crucifixion at Calvary, and resurrection on Easter morning. But the rest of the life of Jesus–all that precede and inform those events–are often not told in a regular, cohesive, dramatic way. This play means to put flesh and bones on the life and ministry of Jesus before he arrives at the cross.

This is the Gospel of Mark. No subtractions from the text, no additions to the text. The Gospel, alive and incarnate for the community to behold and celebrate.
